# Yellowbelly Slider

Trachemys scripta scripta

As their name implies, their plastron (bottom shell) is yellow with some black spots!

Lepomis macrochirus

## Goldfish

Carassius auratus

Originally native to China, goldfish have become popular aquarium fish. As a result, they've been released into the wild and invasive in North America & Australia.



### Green Sunfish

Lepomis cyanellus

Lakes and ponds of eastern North America

Habitat destruction, overfishing

#### **Conservation Status**

Least concern

Green sunfish often spend their time around rocks, plants, and underwater logs for protection from predators! *Lepomis cyanellus* 



## **Longear Sunfish**

Lepomis megalotis

### Roundtail Chub

Gila robusta

#### **Habitat**

Rivers and streams of southwestern North America

#### **Threats**

Habitat destruction, invasive species

Vulnerable

Roundtail chubs are predators, eating fish, crayfish, insects, and even frogs!



# Redtail Splitfin

Xenotoca eiseni

#### **Habitat**

Shallow springs, lakes, rivers of westcentral Mexico

#### **Threats**

Habitat destruction

#### **Conservation Status**

Endangered

Only males have the red-orange tail that gives the species its name!



### Redear Sunfish
