Class and Self-Directed Visits

Kia ora

We aim to ensure that you, your students, and accompanying adults have a safe, enjoyable, and successful visit to SEA LIFE Kelly Tarlton's.

Please encourage students to recognise behaviours that could be unsafe or inappropriate for themselves, SEA LIFE staff, other visitors, the animals, or SEA LIFE property. Establish clear rules and codes of conduct beforehand. Your organisation may already have behavioural guidelines for educational trips, make sure your students are familiar with these expectations.

Below is a guide outlining potential risks identified at SEA LIFE Kelly Tarlton's. However, be aware that other, unlisted hazards may also exist. If you come across any hazards during your visit, please report them immediately to help us maintain a safe environment.

Risk Assessment Information

We strongly recommend that teachers/staff visit the aquarium in advance to conduct their own risk assessment prior to bringing students. To arrange a pre-visit, please contact our Education Lead. If a pre-visit isn't possible, this document offers an overview of known risks.

Students must be supervised at all times during their visit.

If a student has special needs and requires 1:1 support, that carer will be admitted free of charge. (Please notify staff when booking.)

It is essential that students understand:

- The purpose and goals of the visit
- How to avoid dangers and the importance of following rules and instructions
- The reasons for safety measures and the expected standard of behaviour
- Who is responsible for their group
- What to do if approached by someone outside the group
- What steps to take if they become separated from the group

In the event of an emergency, please follow the directions of our staff immediately.
