Salty water



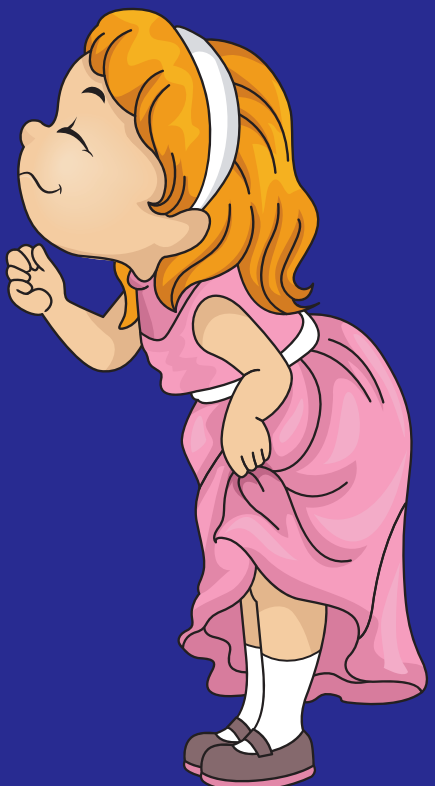
The fish and animals

Hand sanitiser



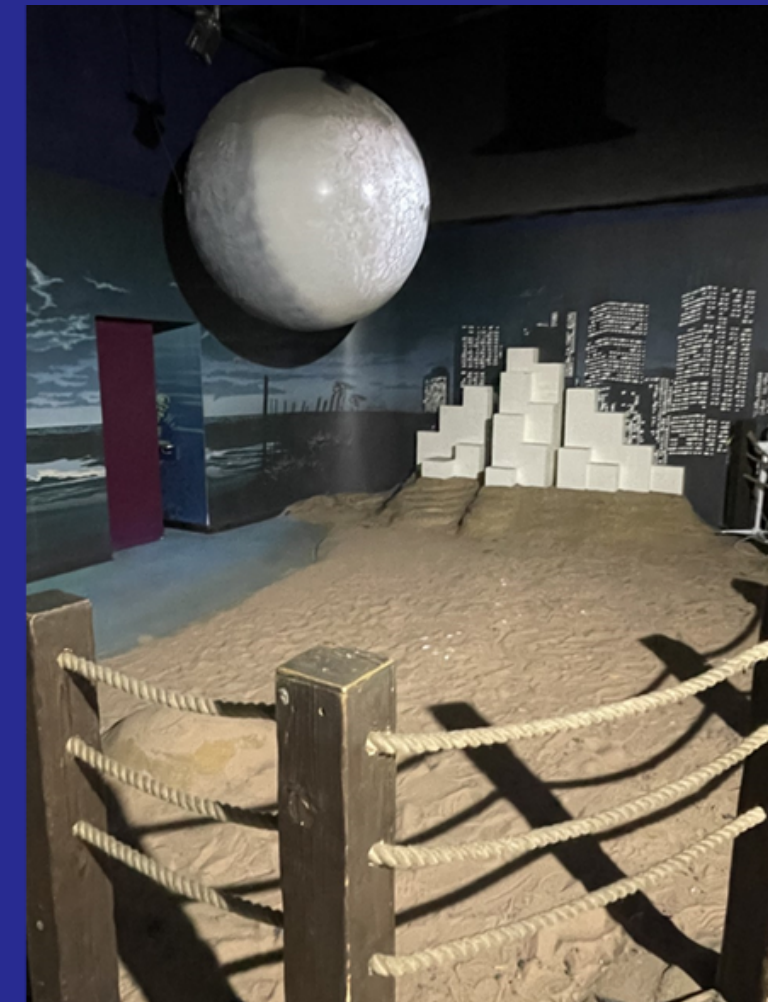
There will be people at the aquarium that I need to share the space with. When we buy or scan our tickets at the entrance, I will stay close to my adult.



I may have to wait and line up before entering. I will be asked if I want to take a photo.



I may have to wait and queue for a show about turtles before entering. This room is dark and can be loud. I will tell my adult if I am uncomfortable so we can move onto the next room.



Some of the animals are big, some are small. They are all behind glass so I can get very close and be safe.



If I need to go to the toilet, I can tell my adult and they will take me. There are toilets next to the play area in the aquarium. When I dry my hands, the dryer makes a loud noise.



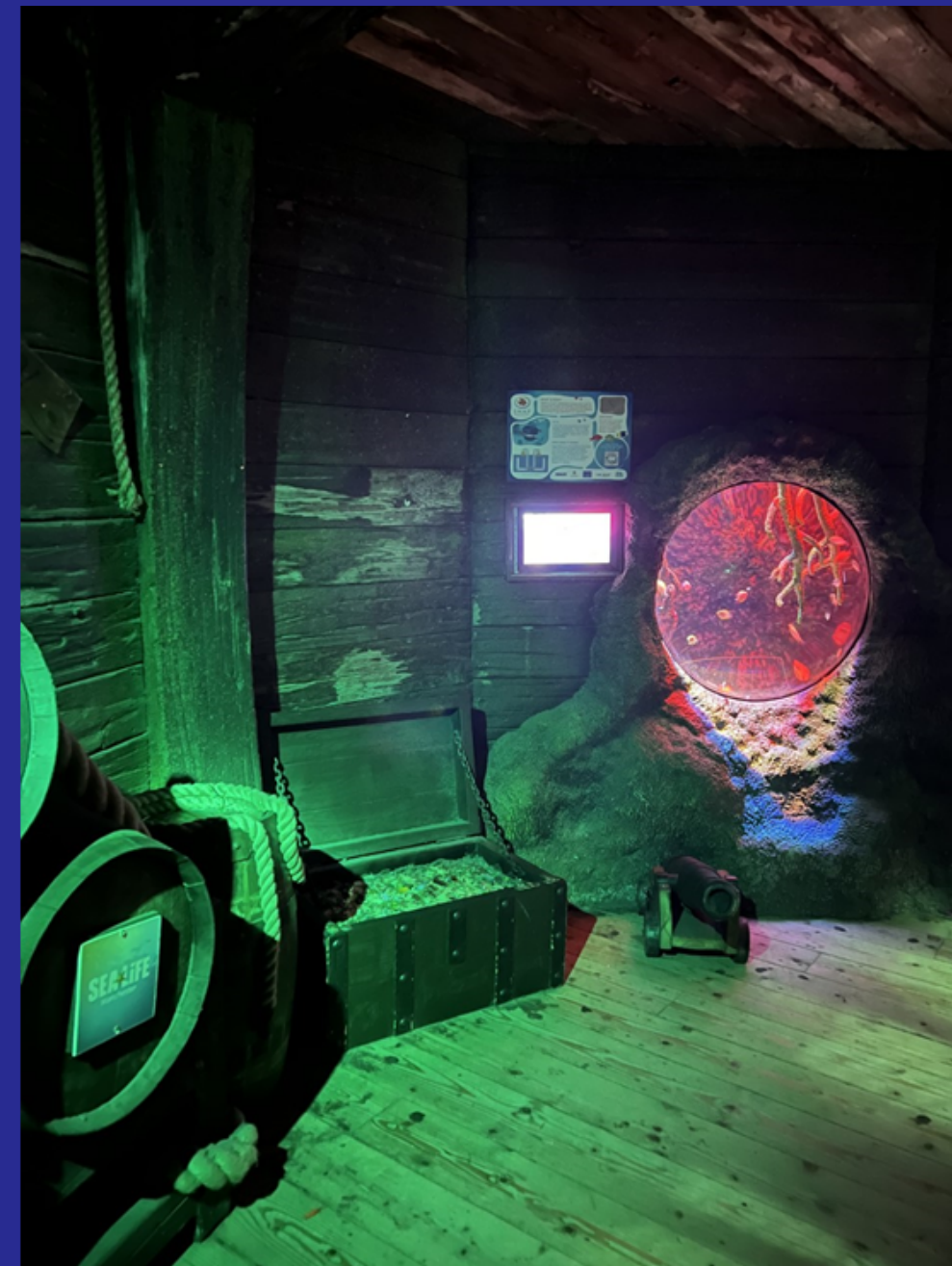
There are lots of staff at the aquarium who can help answer any questions. If I get lost, I can ask them for help. They wear a blue t-shirt or blue jacket and have a radio to talk to other people.



At the rockpool, I may be asked if I want to put my hands in the water and gently touch a starfish. I can just look if I do not want to touch. The staff here can bring a starfish out if I cannot reach.



I will use my quiet voice, even though it may be noisy inside. Some places can be dark and if it makes me feel uncomfortable, I will tell my adult.
