We will wait at the entrance while our teacher goes inside to talk to the staff at front desk.






If there are a lot of us from school, we will break into smaller groups so that it is easier to move around the building.



We will go to the toilet first. If I need to go to the toilet later, I can tell my adult and they will take me. When I dry my hands, the dryer makes a loud noise.






There are lots of different animals that we might see.







If I get lost, I can ask any of the aquarium staff for help. They wear a blue t-shirt and have a radio to talk to other people.




Some of the animals are big, some are small. They are all behind glass so I can get very close and be safe.




At the rock pools, I will be asked if I would like to touch a sea star, they feel rough and wet.

I will be gentle and wait my turn. I can just look if I don't want to touch.






Moving around the Aquarium we may use the escalators—we need to stand still and hold the handrail.
